GOSPEL PRODUCTIONS

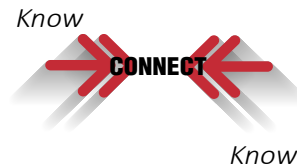
We are thankful to God for the fruitful ministry through the Born Again to a Living Hope Drama we staged in two secondary schools.

We were able to reach **363** students of whom **27** made salvation decisions, **37** rededicated their lives to Christ and **8** were assured of their salvation.

Continue to pray that these students will remain firmly rooted in the faith as they take bold steps in the faith.

Born Again to a Living Hope Drama is based on a true story from a young couple in Argentina named Pablo and Adrianna Riolo whose lives descended into the terrible world of drug addiction, sexual immorality and living together on the streets of Buenos Aires.

Shortly after, it was discovered that they both had contracted AIDS. This powerful drama warns the youth of the dangers of sexual immorality, alcoholism and drug addiction; and provides them with a “Living Hope” through Jesus Christ.



TESTIMONY

I got an opportunity to share with a student from one of the secondary schools who was inspired by the drama and she opened up to me about her friends who were forcing her to get a boyfriend and have sex with him but she did not want to give in.

I talked to her about making a choice to keep pure in her relationships; we also shared a verse from I Corinthians 6:12-20. I encouraged her to stay away from such friends because they were not influencing her positively.

When I shared with her the Gospel, she was very thankful and made a decision to accept Christ. Pray that she will keep pure despite the peer pressure.

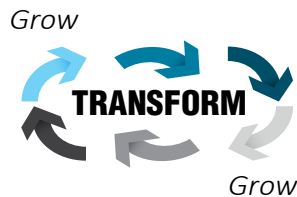
WOLABI INTERNSHIP

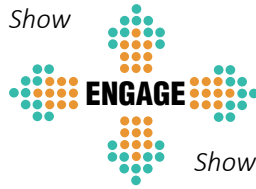
